A child of the Enlightenment, uncensored thought engendered our pluralistic society.

In the 1980s Bill Viola said in an interview:

Wittgenstein:

The meaning of a word is its use in language.

The use is determined by rules.

Wittgenstein calls these rules "Sprachspiele".

In 1961 Marcel Broodthaers married Maria Gilissen. She spoke Flemish, but little French, Marcel the reverse. His early letters to Maria were thus a mixture of text and picture. In the process he discovered the advantages of the picture by comparison with language.
